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INTRODUCTION

Sanyuka Children Ministries, a Ugandan NGO, exists to restore hope, dignity, and tangible opportunities to vulnerable and orphaned children in Uganda through holistic, family-based Christian care; high-quality vocational and academic education; discipleship; and empowerment.

The ministry was founded in 2008 by Allan Kizito, a formerly orphaned child who, through God's grace, the help of a distant relative, and academic scholarships, became a Software Engineer in Uganda. In 2010, Sanyuka was licensed by the Ugandan Ministry of Labor and Gender as an NGO and has since been operated by a dedicated Ugandan team in Kampala.

In 2013, Allan and his wife, Samie, immigrated to the United States. Through God's providence and with the help of U.S. benefactors, they established a 501(c)(3) organization to expand the impact of Sanyuka's work in Uganda.



STEWARDSHIP & EFFICIENCY

- **90.15%** of expenditures directly fund programs serving children.
- **9.85%** supports administration, ensuring transparency, safety, and accountability.
- The **average annual cost per program beneficiary is \$443.95** — less than **\$1.50 per day** to transform a life.

PROGRAM IMPACT HIGHLIGHTS

Lives are changing every day at Sanyuka. Children receive safe shelter, quality education, emotional healing, and spiritual mentorship. Through hands-on training in farming and baking, youth are gaining confidence and practical skills for a brighter future.



PHYSICAL NEEDS (SHELTER, FOOD & HEALTH CARE)

- Secured a long-term lease for a 0.5-acre compound with a large home, detached kitchen, and quarters for older boys (ages 16–19).
- **45 children** received full-time shelter, nutritious meals, and medical support.
- **100%** received preventive healthcare and emotional care.
- Overall child well-being improved, as evidenced by fewer illness-related medical visits




STORY: JUSTINE (AGE 14)

After losing both parents, Justine arrived malnourished and withdrawn. At Sanyuka, she found safety, love, and belonging. Today, she leads morning devotions and dreams of becoming a doctor.

EDUCATION NEEDS (LEARNING & SCHOLARSHIP)

- **109 children** enrolled in top private day and boarding schools as well as vocational education (public options are limited).
- Over **95% attendance** and **100% advancement** to the next academic level.
- **89 beneficiaries** are provided 100% scholarships to attend private day and boarding schools (elementary, middle school, and high school)
- **12 long-term beneficiaries** are now enrolled in Ugandan universities.
- **7 students** are in vocational schools studying mechanics, confectionary, and early childhood education.
- **1 student** earned a private pilot's license and is pursuing a commercial pilot's license.



STORY: VICKY (AGE 17)

Growing up in the slums of Kamwokya, Vicky faced violence and homelessness. Through Sanyuka, she found love, safety, and education — and discovered her identity in Christ.

“I used to think joy and school was for others. Now my dream is to impact my community like Sanyuka has impacted me..”



SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL SUPPORT

- **30 children** received counseling and reintegration follow-up.
- **8 children** reunited with extended families or foster homes.
- **15 group therapy sessions** conducted in 2025.
- **40 children** are provided daily support and a healthy social structure in the Sanyuka Residential Compound

SPIRITUAL & LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

- **300 children** and youth engaged through our school break fellowships and leadership training.
- **30 - 45 children** are discipled and mentored through intentional weekly programming
- **25 youth** trained as peer mentors; **10 now** serve as worship leaders.
- Monthly discipleship retreats reinforced biblical values and life purpose.



TESTIMONY: DAVID (AGE 17)

After enduring physical abuse, family loss, and abject poverty, David found healing and identity through Sanyuka's discipleship. Today, he is a licensed private pilot and a spiritual leader among peers.

"I learned that I am loved by God and I have a purpose. I now help lead prayer and devotions at my Sanyuka family and desire to inspire others with what God had done in my life."




LIVELIHOOD SKILLS & ENTREPRENEURSHIP

- **30+ youth** trained in baking through the **Sanyuka Bakery**, which now produces **300+ loaves and other daily bakery goods** for the local community.
- **Sanyuka Farm** empowers youth with agricultural skills and provides sustainable food production on **10 acres** of farmland.
- Partnerships established with local institutes for training in mechanics, videography, confectionary, and cosmetology.

HEART BEAT PROGRAM (STAFF, PARTNERSHIPS & WELLBEING)

- **10 staff** and caregivers strengthened through annual retreats.
- Focused on mental health, leadership development, and ministry sustainability.
- Fosters a culture of faith, joy, and excellence across all programs.

Looking ahead, Sanyuka aims to ensure every child completes school, receives daily care and discipleship, and grows in faith. The ministry will continue expanding vocational programs and family reintegration efforts — building strong, self-sustaining futures.



Program	2026 Goals
Education	Ensure 100% of enrolled children complete the school year successfully.
Health & Nutrition	Maintain daily nutritious meals and regular healthcare for all residential children.
Spiritual Formation	Engage 300+ youth in discipleship and servant leadership programs.
Family Reunification	Support the reintegration of 15 children into family care.
Vocational Skills	Scale the Bakery and Farm programs to train 30 youth by Q3 2026.

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
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
